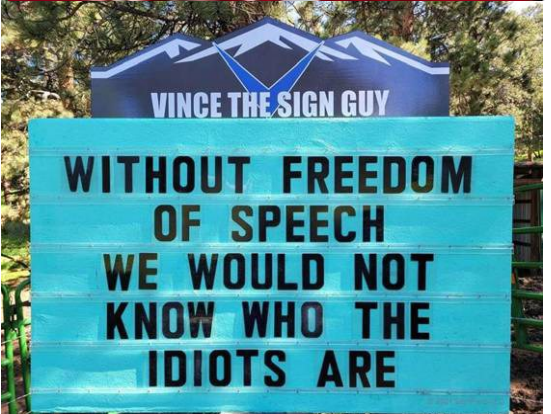
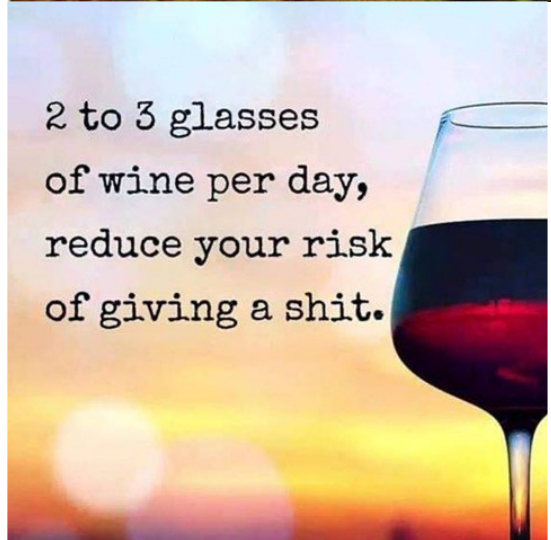
Church Ladies With Typewriters
